MOUTHGUARDS




Sports related dental injuries can be prevented through the use of proper protection. Common dental injuries in sport include: broken, cracked, chipped or lost teeth, lip, cheek or tongue lacerations, joint damage and jaw fractures. Use of mouthguards help to prevent or limit the severity of these injuries. Furthermore, mouthguards worn by players with braces may prevent injuries to another player from their contact with the braces. There is limited evidence to support the idea that mouthguards protect against, or reduce the risk of concussion. Injuries to the mouth and jaw are often painful, costly and difficult to treat. In severe cases, surgery and hospitalisation may be necessary.

Sports Medicine Australia and the Australian Dental Association released a joint recommendation in 2015 stating that use of custom-fitted mouthguards for all contact sport participants reduces the risk and injuries. severity of dental **Custom-fitted** mouthguards come in several types, the simplest of these is a vacuum formed guard made from a single layer. More complex designs incorporate multiple layers or laminations of material, which are bonded together under high pressure and high temperature to form the final unit. This technique allows for greater shock absorption when used in collision sports and can be made to suit the requirements of the individual. In general terms, a custom-fitted design is necessary to ensure a comfortable fit of the mouthguard during use.

Injury prevention in sport is best achieved by being well prepared. This includes mouth protection in the form of a custom-fitted mouthguard to ensure the best possible chance to prevent serious injury. The AFL and some sports clubs from Water Polo, Rugby League and Basketball have issued policies backing the use of mandatory mouthguard usage during training and games.

'Stock' and 'Boil and Bite' mouthguard designs do not afford much protection. They tend to fit poorly, and often interfere with breathing and speech. Their only advantage is their low cost and availability. Unfortunately, these are often favoured by parents and participants who are under the false impression that the level of protection received from a stock mouthguard is comparable to a custom-fitted mouthguard. Regrettably, that is not the case. It is important to convey to patients the cost of a custom-fitted mouthguard is far less than the cost of a Routine check-ups provide an dental injury. opportunity for dentists to educate parents and participants about the superior advantage a custom-fitted mouthguard provides.
